


Annual Live Nativity Walk

So many refugee families helped in 2023!

2023 was our busiest year ever! Each month, we set a new record helping the many refugees coming to Rochester. In 2023 alone, Saint's Place gave away over 850 new beds, 900 new pillows, 1,700 sets of sheets and towels, over 300 sofas, and more!

Our fundraisers, like the Patron Saint's Campaign and the Annual Super Sale, were very successful. These, along with our grant writing and individual donations, allowed us to assist more than 1,300 newly arrived refugees.







25th Anniversary



This year, Saint's Place celebrated 25 years of "Welcoming the Stranger." Since 1998, Saint's Place has helped over 31,000 refugees from over 30 countries. From a small group of passionate individuals, the ministry has expanded. Now, over 100 active volunteers donate their time and talents year-round, assisting refugees to settle, build a home, and grow roots here in Rochester, New York. 

Over this past year, the phrase "Eucharistic Revival" has been repeated. But what is it? The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to the Eucharist here in the United States. Each Parish in Rochester has been working towards providing opportunities for Parishioners to reconnect with this core aspect of our faith.

In preparation for the Year of Parish Eucharistic Revival, the book 7 Secrets of the Eucharist, by Vinny Flynn, was given out at Christmas 2022 Masses, and a Fruit of the Vine about the book was held in June.

In February 2023, we hosted the Eucharistic Miracle Exposition of Blessed Carlo Acutis for three weeks in the Parish Meeting Hall. We launched the opening of the Expo with Mass, Adoration, and a special talk given by Fr. Jeffrey Chichester.

Two Eucharistic Processions were held, one in June for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi and another in October, in collaboration with St. Bernard's School of Theology and Ministry.

The return of First Friday Adoration and Confession were among the many worship opportunities that were revived in 2023!







Marriage Vow Renewals

On February 11, the annual Marriage Vow Renewal Ceremony and Reception took place after the 4:30 pm Mass.

More than 30 couples participated, renewing their vows and recieving a small keepsake to take home to remember the event.
