

#### Pentecost & Corpus Christi

Pentecost, celebrated 50 days after the Resurrection of Jesus, marks the celebration when the Holy Spirit descended upon the 12 Apostles and Mary. We traditionally call this day the 'Birthday of the Church,' because it is the day on which the Apostles left the upper room, no longer afraid, and preached the Gospel to all of Jerusalem! The colors the priest wear for Mass this day are red for the Holy Spirit. Many St. Louis parishioners joined in wearing red and orange hues. The congregation that day looked like it was ablaze with the Spirit!

Shortly after Pentecost, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, also known as Corpus Christi. This year, Corpus Christi was special in many ways. First, it marked the start of the National Eucharistic Revival (more about that on page 6). Second, it marked the first public homily of our newly ordained Deacon Gerard de la Fuente! And last, but certainly not least, in keeping with tradition around the world, St. Louis Church held a Eucharistic Procession around the front of the Church with the Blessed Sacrament.
